SAFE ARRIVAL

The Ministry of Education has instituted a Safe Arrival Policy for students at school. This means that when a student is absent, we require notification of the absence. You can greatly assist us by telephoning the school or informing the teacher of the absence. If the child's absence is planned due to an appointment or other commitment, please send a note to the teacher or you may call the school and leave a message on the answering machine.

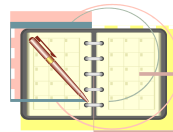
Visitor's and Drop-off & Pick-up Protocol

As a safety precaution, and to avoid the disruption and interruption of the learning environment, we will continue to follow the protocol below for all visitors to the school, including parents.

- All visitors/parents must report to the office. Visitors who need to go beyond the office into the school population will be given identification badges to wear and will be required to sign the visitor's log and indicate the reason for the visit.
- Parents picking up children at the school will be asked to wait at the office or outside where students exit.
- Appointments to visit a classroom or meet a teacher should be made ahead of time at a mutually agreeable time.
- **All entrances will be locked at all times.**

STUDENT AGENDAS

The planner is the main tool for all of our students for organizational skills. Teachers will enable students to use the planner to learn to schedule and set priorities. The planner is also the main communication tool between the teacher and home. Please send notes in the planner and check daily for communications from the classroom. Please check your child's agenda each evening or have them check it for notes or homework if your child is using an agenda in his/her class.

Use of Computers, Networks and Technological Devices

The RCDSB Administrative Procedure 141 addresses the implications of the use of technology in terms of safety, privacy and intrusion into district schools. The procedure states clear expectations for all Users who access the Board network or who use Board or Personal-owned devices while on Board property. The full Procedure is published at the RCDSB website: www.rcdsb.on.ca (and click on "Board" then the "Administrative Procedures" link).

Users are required to promote responsible use of board resources and to refrain from unauthorized access or abuse. Users are expected to make every attempt to avoid inappropriate materials. They are required to use computers and electronic devices as educational, business and communications tools and to avoid any use which has a negative impact on safe, caring and orderly schools/administrative buildings.

Personal technological devices may be used during instructional time for educational purposes under the direction of the teacher. Students must follow the rules of the classroom and school policy.

The school and/or RCDSB is not responsible for personal technological devices in the event of loss, damage or theft.

Cyber bullying is using electronic means to intimidate, harm, shun, attack or ruin a reputation. Cyber bullying includes the use of e-mails and instant messaging, text or digital imaging sent on cell phones, web pages and web logs (blogs), chat rooms and discussion groups.

Cyber bullying, when taking place off the school/work site or outside school/work hours normally are not school/work matters, but rather community or police issues. However, these activities can have an impact on the school/work and negatively affect the safety, climate and the learning environment at the school/work. In such cases, the use of the Internet and electronic messaging for bullying or harassment may be dealt with by the Principal.



Labour Update for Elementary School

As a result of strike action by the Elementary Teachers' Federation of Ontario, the Board has received notice that elementary teachers will no longer be planning, organizing or participating in any field trips. Teachers will not be collecting any monies or be involved in any fundraising activities. Teachers will not participate in any "Meet the Teacher" events occurring outside of instructional hours. Elementary teachers may continue with sports and other extra-curricular activities as long as they are not handling money or paperwork needed by the school. Negotiations continue at the provincial and local level and updates will be posted on the RCDSB website as new information becomes available.

Important News for Parents/Volunteers

A reminder that all parents/volunteers need a Criminal Background Check to help in the school or assist on school excursions. To avoid disappointment it is recommended that parents apply for a CBC at the beginning of the school year. There is a form which the OPP requires from the parent/volunteer to complete, which is available through the school office. It is suggested you apply for a CBC as soon as possible. Once you have a CBC it is good with the Board for three years, but volunteers need to complete an Offence Declaration each year until the three year period is up. Parents unsure of their CBC date can contact the school office. Get your CBC now to avoid disappointment later when wanting to participate in school activities with your child. If you would like to help out in the school or with any trips or events, please let your child's teacher know that you are willing to help! Thanks in advance for your help!

Kids Plus Accident Insurance

The School Board does not pay for accident expenses if your child is injured on school property. You may wish to consider the student accident insurance offered each year at this time.

MEDICATION

Medication of any kind cannot be administered at the school unless a parent fills out a **Consent Form for the Administration of Health Service and/or Prescribed Medication**. This form is available at the office. Parents must fill out a new form every school year, so if your child was receiving medication last year and you have not filled out a form you should do so a.s.a.p. **NO** medication will be given to a child without this form. Short term medication, i.e., an antibiotic for colds or infection, will **not** be administered by the school. Parents will need to make alternate arrangements for their child. Parents of students who are part of our medical protocol, i.e., anaphylactic, should have received current documentation that needs to be updated. If you did not receive a package containing your child's information please contact the office.

HEADLICE
